


Cat Puzzles

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

1. A unique genetic makeup.
3. Grand Master, a title.
4. A localized collection of pus in part of the body, formed by tissue disintegration and surrounded by an inflamed area. In cats, these are commonly the result of bites or scratches occurring from fighting and, if left untreated, can be fatal.
6. One of the oldest cat breeds, the _____ have long, distinctive head. This breed is seen in only two colors, lilac and brown, and almost always has green eyes.
10. Domestic or purebred cat that is not registered and is a pet. Household pets can compete in special categories in cat shows.
14. Odd Eyed White.
15. Also called tortoiseshell. Usually a female. The coat colors are cream, red and blank intermingled together.
17. A cat's fur.
18. Oriental Shorthairs of America, a breed club.
19. A break, rupture, or crack, especially in bone or cartilage.
21. Premier, a title. (In FIFe, it is spelled "Premior.")
22. A substance, such as chlorophyll or melanin, that produces a characteristic color in plant or animal tissue.
23. International Premier, a title.
24. International Champion, a title.
25. A recording of a cat's birth, ancestry and other particulars with an official organization.
29. The Traditional Cat Association, a cat registering association based in the US.

1. Domestic longhair, a longhair of unknown or mixed parentage.
2. Any Other Variety class at a North American show is open to purebred and registered cats that are not eligible to compete because their color, hair length, or another characteristic does not meet the standard for their breed.
3. Hereditary units that control growth, development and the physical characteristics of a cat and that are found in specific locations of a chromosome.
5. Primarily dark points, nearly black with an underlying tortoiseshell color pattern.
7. American Shorthair, a breed.
8. The manner in which one behaves.
9. A cat exhibited in a show.
11. Outstanding Dam, a title.
12. Longhair.
13. An abnormal growth of tissue resulting from uncontrolled, progressive multiplication of cells and serving no physiological function; a neoplasm.
15. An amino acid which a cat has to get in a diet for good eyesight.
16. Regional Winner in CFA, this title is awarded to cats that have earned a Regional award.
17. Any of various aromatic, ornamental, annual or perennial plants of the genus *Nepeta*, having opposite leaves and variously colored flowers with two-lipped corollas.
19. Any of various small, wingless, bloodsucking insects of the order Siphonaptera that have legs adapted for jumping and are parasitic on warm-blooded animals.
20. To spay or neuter a cat. An "alter" is an altered cat.
26. Grand Champion, a title.
27. An "allbreed ring" at a show is a ring in which cats of all breeds are judged and ranked against each other. An "allbreed judge" is a judge who is licensed to judge allbreed rings. Compare with specialty.
28. International Winner, a title.
